

SCHOOL-BASED SUICIDE PREVENTION TRAINING

Wisconsin's youth suicide rate is consistently among the highest in the nation. We lose an average of one young person age 10-19 every 10 days to suicide; it is the second leading cause of death, and accounts for almost 1 in 5 of all deaths among Wisconsin youth. The most recent multi-year analysis of national data (CDC, 1999-2007) puts Wisconsin's rate 14th highest for ages 10-19.

DPI offers free, continually-updated workshops to help schools improve suicide prevention efforts and meet the requirements of state law. The training can be provided in your area, and includes school-tested, comprehensive, **evidence-based prevention and curriculum materials!** We have recently added new prevention programs, **a middle-school health class curriculum**, and additional resources. This workshop helps you understand the scope of youth suicide and what schools can do to reduce suicidal acts and thoughts among students. Participants learn about the prevalence of youth suicide, risk and protective factors, comprehensive prevention programs, and crisis intervention. **State law requires school districts to provide specific classroom instruction in youth suicide prevention and to annually notify staff about DPI's resources.** We discuss the state requirements, and help you gain new knowledge and skills to improve classroom instruction at the middle- and high-school level. You will participate in authentic, performance-based assessments—strategies to help students understand suicide and demonstrate their knowledge. We share a variety of effective and inexpensive classroom programs.

This workshop is not intended to train all school staff, but prepares teams of pupil services staff, health educators, and administrators to plan, prevent, and intervene at their schools. Action planning is integrated into all phases of the training program. A CD-ROM with complete program materials and a model workshop for all school staff are provided. **PLEASE BRING YOUR SUICIDE CRISIS RESPONSE PLANS FOR REVIEW, DISCUSSION, AND REVISION.**

Anyone can schedule and sponsor this one-day workshop. Training runs from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. To schedule, decide what date(s) you have available for the training and contact Brenda Jennings at DPI at (608) 266-7051. Trainers are DPI staff. Reservations should be made early, because trainer availability is limited. Groups must number at least 20, with larger groups strongly encouraged. Local sponsors are responsible for recruiting participants, reservations, training site logistics, meals, and refreshments. Technical requirements include a DVD player, an LCD projector, screen, computer speakers, and a wireless lapel microphone. Handouts and other materials are provided by DPI. Local sponsors may charge a nominal fee adequate to cover their expenses (meals, promotion, etc.), but this is not intended to be a for-profit event. Scholarships are encouraged.
